Adolf Hitler	1934	"The man's world is big compared to the woman's. The man belongs to his duty, and only now and then does a thought wander over to the woman. The woman's world is the man. She only thinks about other things from time to time."	excerpt from a speech Hitler delivered to National Socialist Women's League. propaganda, which Hitler used to make sure German women would reproduce enough to sustain his army
Austin Mitchell (British Politician, Labor Party)	2012	"A good wife doesn't disagree with her master in public and a good little girl doesn't lie about why she quit politics."	reaction to the resignation of politician Louise Mensch, whose reasons for her resignation did not match the reasons her husband later gave the press. Mitchell tweeted this to discredit Mensch's credibility as well as her status as a politician
Björn Höcke (German Politician, far right wing party AfD)	2015	"We need to rediscover our masculinity. Because only when we rediscover our masculinity will we become manly. And only when we become manly will we become defensive, and we must become defensive, dear friends!"	a speech delivered to his followers in Erfurt, big Nazi-Demo -> response to "gender-craziness" and the "downfall of Germany"
Cheryl Rios (American business women)	2015	"... a female shouldn't be president. Let the haters begin . . . but with the hormones we have there is no way we should be able to start a war. (...) being the President, that should be left to a man, a good, strong, honorable man."	Rios stated this on Facebook, going viral in the US in the context of the upcoming election 2016
Elizabeth Cady Stanton (US suffragette)	1848	"The best protection any woman can have... is courage."	Stanton was one of the US' leading women's rights activists in the 19th century, constantly pushing for women to be more included in the public sphere and to take up the space men were denying them

Who	When	What	Context
Janusz Korwin-Mikke (Polish politician, at the time member of European Parliament)	2017	“Women must earn less than men, because they are weaker, they are smaller, they are less intelligent”	this was stated by Korwin-Mikke in European Parliament during a debate on the gender pay gap
Petra Jelínková (Green Party at district level in Prague)	2020	“I remember I went to a public discussion on social policy and the very first question I received from the host was, So, it must be really hard for your husband – when do you do the ironing for him? Do you even iron his shirts?”	Jelínková (active in the Green party at District level) shared this in an interview on women in Czech politics and their chance of becoming Prime minister
Simone de Beauvoir (writer, philosopher and one of the most known feminists)	1949	“...in the past all history was made by males. At the moment that women are beginning to share in the making of the world, this world still belongs to men: men have no doubt about this, and women barely doubt it.” “women’s entire history has been written by men”	this is stated in Beauvoir’s book “The second sex”, one of the best-known pieces of feminist literature
Waltraud Schoppe (German politician of the Green Party)	1983	“We call on you to finally take note of the fact that women also have a right to self-determination over their bodies and their lives. We call on you all to stop the everyday sexism here in Parliament”	her 1st speech in Parliament; Schoppe demands that marital rape is considered a criminal offense
Yoko Ono (artist, filmmaker and singer)	2005	“There’s many women now who think, ‘Surely we don’t need feminism anymore, we’re all liberated and society’s accepting us as we are.’ Which is ball hogwash. It’s not true at all.”	Stated by her in an article/interview with the Guardian they did about her & her life/age/influence
